DAY ONE – Buffalo Bill and American Gothic

We begin our touring at the Buffalo Bill Museum in LeClaire, Iowa. Named after hometown boy William Frederick Cody, the Buffalo Bill Museum displays the fascinating history along the Mighty Mississippi River highlighted by the wooden hull steam-powered Paddle Wheeler Lone Star. Then, we make a stop at the small Iowa farmhouse immortalized in Grant Wood's classic painting *American Gothic* to learn more about the artist and the history behind the painting. (Dinner)

DAY TWO – John Wayne and the Pony Express

The life story of one of Hollywood's biggest actors began in the small town of Winterset, Iowa. John Wayne was born Marion Robert Morrison on May 26, 1907 in a modest four-room home which has been lovingly restored. The newly expanded John Wayne Birthplace and Museum houses the most diversified exhibit

of John Wayne artifacts including original movie posters, scripts, film wardrobe and even one of this customized automobiles. In Saint Joseph we hear about one of the greatest stories of the American West, the Pony Express. We visit the original livery stable where the first rider, Johnny Fry left on April 3, 1860, which was a successful venture for only 19 months when the Pacific telegraph line was completed. Tonight, our dinner is highlighted by a visit from Calamity Jane who will provide some rousing Western entertainment. (Breakfast and dinner)

DAY THREE – Eclipse Day in Saint Joseph, Missouri

We begin the day at Missouri Western State University, home to the Walter Cronkite Memorial, dedicated to the famed broadcast journalist and TV anchorman. Learn about his personal life as well as his career. See the replica of the CBS newsroom and even sit behind his famous news desk. Then, we take our place to view one of the earth's great wonders, a total solar eclipse. We will enjoy an included box lunch and will have special eye-wear and seating to witness this once-in-a-lifetime event. Afterward, we cross into Kansas to visit the Amelia Earhart Birthplace, a National Historic Site, to learn about one of the world's most influential female aviators. Built in the early 1860s, the home has been returned to its turn-ofthe-century condition and features an abundance of personal and family memorabilia. (Breakfast and lunch)

DAY FOUR – Walt Disney and Mark Twain

The town of Marceline, Missouri is home to the Walt Disney Hometown Museum. Here, a unique collection of Disney family memorabilia, interpretive exhibits and the only Disney attraction to be operated outside of the park. Arriving in Hannibal, we visit the Mark Twain Boyhood Home and Museum. Consisting of eight buildings, six of which are on the National Register, the complex includes interactive museums and a collection of original Norman Rockwell paintings. Learn how a young boy growing up in the small village of Hannibal became one of the world's most beloved authors. After checking into our hotel we climb aboard the Mark Twain Riverboat for a narrated dinner cruise along "Ol' Man River." (Breakfast and dinner)

DAY FIVE – Abraham Lincoln Museum and Home

After breakfast we depart for home. We make a stop at the impressive Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum for a look at the life of America's 16th President. Later, we arrive home. (Breakfast)
